**Remember to re-apply for student finance**

If you're a UK or EU student continuing your studies in 2020/21, remember to apply for your student finance.

If your parent, partner or carers combined household income is expected to drop by 15% or more in the 2020/21 tax year, compared to 2018/19, you can ask Student Finance England (SFE) to recalculate your student finances. Full information can be found on the **gov.uk website**.

## EU settled status information


The UK Government has confirmed that EU citizens must enter the UK before 31 December 2020 and will have until 30 June 2021 to apply for settled status, if they wish to stay after this date.
