BU has fallen **16 places to 94th** out of the 131 Universities listed in the 2020 Times and Sunday Times University League Tables (T&ST).

BU performance has improved in two of the nine measures this year, completion rate and spending on services/facilities. Three measures have held steady but both National Student Survey (NSS) measures have now fallen back below their 2018 scores following improvements in 2019. In terms of the rankings the picture is more positive with a better ranking seen in 4 measures. Graduate prospects and student staff ratio (SSR) have seen an improvement in their rankings having fallen 25 and 14 places respectively in 2018.

BU's relative position to the sector in 2020 (as indicated by the shading) in the table above has not changed since 2019 in all of the measures except for Research Quality which has improved from lower inter-quartile to being at the median in 2019 and in the two NSS measures which have fallen from the lower-inter quartile and back into the lower quartile after the opposite move in 2019.

The completion rate has seen the best performance in terms of rankings moving up by 8 places to 67th. This builds on a gain of 2 places in 2019 and this improvement now has BU just 0.1% below the median score of 85.4%.

The Student Staff Ratio (SSR) at BU has remained constant at 17 students per staff FTE. This has resulted in an improvement of 3 places in the rankings as the Q1 SSR has worsened from 17.5 in 2019 to 17.7 in 2020 while the median has remained the same at 15.8. This measure takes the total student FTE (as defined in the HESA session population) and divides it by total academic staff FTE (excluding research only staff). Students on a full year placement are adjusted to 20% and those on part year placement adjusted to 60% of their original FTE.

A stable result is also seen in Graduate Prospects with the score unchanged from last year as the same data (for 2017 graduates) is being used again. This is following the review by HESA of the way they capture graduate data and the implementation of the Graduate Outcomes record – with the first survey of graduates completed in December 2018, and the first data to be published in Spring 2020. This is likely to first impact the league table in T&ST 2021.

In 2020, BU has increased expenditure by an average of £47 over two years on academic services and staff and student facilities per student FTE. However, as in 2019, despite spending more BU has fallen again in the rankings (by 7 places to 65th). BU remains in the upper inter-quartile range but is now only £7 above the median of £2,318 which itself has risen from £2,198 in 2019 as spending rises across the sector.

The rate of First/2:1s has fallen by 2.5% to 76.4% in 2020 which has led to a fall of 15 places in the rankings. This fall takes BU back below the 2018 score of 77.2% following the improvement in 2019 (to 78.9%). BU remains in the upper inter-quartile but is now much closer to the median which has risen across the sector from 73.5% in 2019 to 75.1% in 2020.

Performance has declined in both of the NSS measures, a 1.3% decrease in Teaching Quality and 1.8% decrease in Student Experience resulting in a ranking decrease of 18 places for Teaching Quality and 25 places for Student Experience. In both measures, BU has now fallen back into the lower quartile after being in the lower inter-quartile in 2019. The Q1 scores for the sector have increased slightly since 2019 (from 77.8% to 78.0%) for Teaching Quality and have risen by 0.7% to 76.5% for Student Experience and so the fall in performance has been compounded by an increase in the Q1 score across the sector.

The Teaching Quality measure reflects the average scores of the teaching, learning opportunities, assessment and feedback, and academic support sections of the NSS. The Student Experience measure is drawn from the average scores of the organisation and management, learning resources, learning community and student voice sections and the additional question on overall satisfaction.

Teaching Quality continues to be favoured over student experience and accounts for 67% of the overall score covering Student Satisfaction, with Student Experience making up the remaining 33%. This combined “score” is then weighted by 1.5 (alongside Research Quality – all other measures are weighted 1) in the main table to provide one overall score covering student satisfaction.

Overall BU performance amongst our peers has declined in 2020. BU ranks **21st/34** among Former Polytechnics (down 6), **40th/70** among Post 1992 Universities (down 15) and **9th/12** among South West universities (down 2). Amongst our UCAS market competitors BU remains unchanged continuing to rank **6th/7**. Full peer group tables are shown in section 3 of this paper and it is also worth noting that BU has improved to 5th/6 among our current competitors due to the fall in the rankings from 76 to 100 by Brunel University London.

BU has fallen from the middle third of this table in 2019 to the bottom third in 2020 with a ranking of 94th. The middle third remains the most congested as in 2019.

The difference in score between the top and the bottom ranked providers in the middle 3rd (those ranked 45th to 88th) is only 120 points, 47% less than those in the bottom 3rd (those ranked 89th to 131st) where the score difference is 225 points, and 70% less than those at the top of the table (ranked 1st to 44th) with a difference in score of 394 points. These differences are very similar to last year when the differences in scores between top and bottom were 392 for the top 3rd, 120 for the middle 3rd and 223 for the lower 3rd.

The following tables are calculated by measuring the distance in a provider's performance from the sector mean. As in 2019, for BU, the Research Quality and Graduate Prospects scores are still the measures furthest away from the mean when weighted and transformed. The percentage for Research Quality has not changed since 2019 but the fall in the mean score for the sector has moved BU closer to the mean. With a 1.5 weighting any Research Quality score improvements will have a greater impact on the overall score.

The completion rate percentage is again the best performing measure here. The mean across the sector has risen by 0.3% but the 1.2% improvement at BU has exceeded this to give an overall increase of 0.9%.

As outlined previously the NSS scores for Teaching Quality and Student Experience have moved further below the mean in 2020. However, with a weighting of 1.5, improvements in this area, particularly Teaching Quality given its higher weighting in the combined calculation, could have a significant impact in 2021.

BU has appeared in 25 of the T&ST 2020 subject tables. Improvements have been made in 10 subject tables, most notably “Drama, Dance and Cinematics” and “Law” which have both increased by 21 places since 2019. These two subjects have seen improvements in all subject table measures with “Drama, Dance and Cinematics” seeing a 19.4% improvement from 52.5% to 71.9% in Student Experience. Although Teaching Quality still accounts for 67% of the overall NSS score, with Student Experience making up the remaining 33%, all measures in the subject tables carry equal weighting. 3 subjects appear in the top half of their subject tables again this year. “Social Work” has improved its top half position by 6 places to 28th/93. The other two subjects, “Art & Design” and “Hospitality, Leisure, Recreation and Tourism” are still in the top half but have fallen back in the rankings by 13 and 2 places respectively.

“Physiotherapy” and “Business Studies” had both moved into the top half in 2019 but a 16 place fall for “Physiotherapy” has seen it drop into the lower-third in 2020. This is due to significant decreases in both NSS measures. The 4 place fall for “Business Studies” sees it fall to 60th/120 and so it is in fact on the 50% centile. The overall score for “Business Studies” has actually risen and so this fall in ranking is due to the scores for the sector improving by a higher amount than at BU.

Improvements in Teaching Quality have been reported in 12 out of the 25 subject tables, with 6 subjects now showing above average performance for that table (it was 9 in 2019), including “Food Science” where BU is ranked 4th/41 for this measure, “General Engineering” (BU is 7th/40) and “English” (BU is 19th/103 which is up from 58th in 2019). Seven BU subjects are above their table average for Student Experience (it was 8 in 2019), including “Food Science” (ranked 3rd/41 in this measure – up 5 places since 2019), “Anthropology” (13th/24 – up 3 places) and “English” (24th/103 – up 42 places from 66th in 2019).

BU performance can be compared across the subjects (and measures) in the following table; performance is given further context by highlighting in blue where BU is above the average.
