## **APPENDIX 3: TARIFF OF PENALTIES**

## **General information**

- A piece of work may constitute or form part of a formal element of assessment or it may be an informal sub- element which contributes towards a formal element.
- In some circumstances it may be appropriate to refer the case on to be considered under the Fitness to Practise Procedure.

## NO CASE TO ANSWER OR POOR ACADEMIC PRACTICE EVIDENT

Where the Faculty investigation/Panel/Board determines that there is **no case to answer** it shall act in accordance with the guidance provided in the policy and procedure.

Where the Faculty investigation/Panel/Board determines that **poor academic practice is evident** it shall act in accordance with the guidance provided in the policy and procedure.

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Penalty	MAJOR UNIVERSITY OFFENCE - (refer to penalties 1 – 6)
5.	Withdrawal: The student may not be reassessed and is withdrawn from the programme with immediate effect in accordance with the assessment regulations for that programme.  The student will have all credit stripped from their assessment record for the level and will leave Bournemouth University with no credit for that level but may be eligible for an intermediate award.  The student cannot transfer to any programme within Bournemouth University using any credit gained and nor may they be re-enrolled into the same programme at a later date.
6.	Withdrawal: The student may not be reassessed and is withdrawn from the programme with immediate effect in accordance with the assessment regulations for that programme.  The student will have all credit stripped from their assessment record for the level and previous levels and will leave Bournemouth University with no credit for the programme.  The student will not be allowed to re-enrol on the programme at a later date.
