“Backup is a copy of a file that can be used to recover the original file if it has been damaged or lost.”

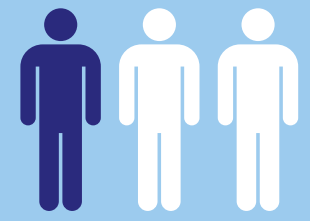
Data loss can happen to anyone at any given time. For instance, a single computer failure or infection with malware (e.g. ransomware) could result in data becoming inaccessible. Losing data is inconvenient, having a backup of your files ensures the continuity of your work and saves you having to reproduce your data.



Over 100 phones stolen every minute.



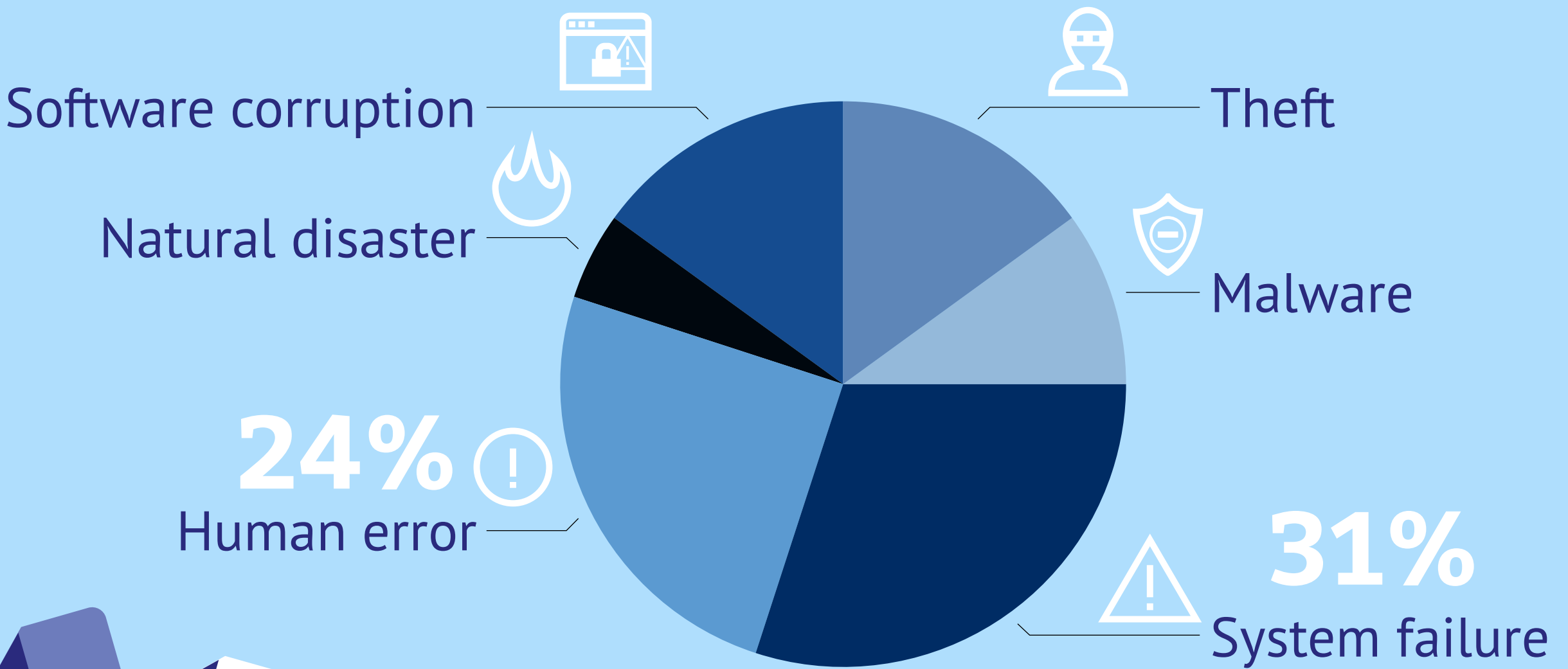
1 in 10 computers infected with malware every month.
