Health Insurance	Exchange students are obliged to arrange for sufficient health insurance coverage during their study period.
	You can apply for an EHIC/GHIC card which enables you to obtain medical assistance for free when abroad. If you are an EU passport holder you will be able to use your EHIC card when travelling to an EU country. If you are a UK passport holder and/or do not have an EU passport, please read the information about how to apply for a UK GHIC card . As a BU student, you can apply for your EHIC/GHIC card using the BU Letter Request Form .
	Please note that some non-European partners request that incoming students purchase additional health insurance to comply with their immigration and institutional requirements.

Travel Insurance	BU offers a comprehensive <u>BU travel cover</u> to all outgoing students. after reviewing BU's travel cover, and depending on personal considerations or specific health issues, some students might decide to purchase an additional insurance policy to top-up what is available.

Visas & Permits	When travelling to Finland you must consider what document(s) you will need to enter the country and commence your studies or research at Haaga-Helia. This will depend on the country you are travelling from, your home citizenship, the length of your stay in Finland, and the purpose of your stay in Finland amongst other criteria.
	Please make sure to understand what is needed and secure this in time before you travel and that you have an up-to-date passport that expires no earlier than 6 months after you intend to return.
	Haaga-Helia will send you a residence permit invitation which is needed to start the student residence permit application. Please liaise with them and refer to information on their webpage for more information:
