Health Insurance	You will be responsible for your own medical and dental costs during your stay in Macao, China. You are therefore required to take out an appropriate travel and health insurance scheme.			
	All exchange students must enrol in an appropriate insurance plan to protect themselves in case of accidents and they will be requested to provide a copy of the Insurance certificate and policy before departure from home. The insurance plan should cover the entire exchange period with the start date and end date matching the student's flight departure date/return flight arrival date and the following items:			
	 Medical expenses (including out-patient, hospital expenses and accident) Personal accident (as the result of any illness, injury, disability or accident) Personal liability covering the legal liability of causing the death of a third party or property damage due to negligence Emergency medical evacuation and repatriation of remains (due 			
Travel Insurance	to accident/illness/other causes). BU offers a comprehensive BU travel cover to all outgoing students.			
	after reviewing BU's travel cover, and depending on personal considerations or specific health issues, some students might decide to purchase an additional insurance policy to top-up what is available.			
	Please note that BU Travel Cover is updated every August.			
Visas & Permits	When travelling to Macao you must consider what document(s) you will need to enter the country and commence your studies or research at IFTM. This will depend on the country you are travelling from, your home citizenship, the length of your stay in Macao, and the purpose of your stay in Macao amongst other criteria.			
	Please make sure to understand what is needed and secure this in time before you travel and that you have an up-to-date passport that expires no earlier than 6 months after you intend to return.			
	IFTM assists non-local students in applying for a temporary resident permit (student visa) soon after their arrival in Macao. The processing time can be around 45 days.			

For students who have plans to travel to Mainland China, it is strongly recommended that students apply for their entry visa to Mainland China at the nearest Embassy of the People's Republic of China in their home country before departure to Macao.
