Apply for healthcare cover abroad (GHIC/EHIC)	If you are a EU national you can still apply to get an EHIC card to study in another EU country. Consider health risks.	Travel to some countries will require you to be vaccinated against certain illnesses. Find out about health risks and vaccinations for travel to your destination country at the NHS fitfortravel website. Destinations - Fit for Travel (scot.nhs.uk)	
Take copies of Important documents.	Don't forget to pack your insurance details with you, as well as a copy of your passport. It's also a good idea to email yourself the details, just in case you lose your photocopy. Leave details at home too.	
List important numbers	It is a wise decision to jot down the telephone numbers for lost and stolen cards, found on the back of your card. These vary from bank to bank. You can email the list to yourself as well as put the numbers in your mobile phone for quick access if needed.	
Stay in touch	If you change your SIM when travelling abroad, remember to update your BU multi-factor authentication so that you don't lose access to your BU student email, Brightspace and other login services.
