The University of Jaén has a wide academic offer including more than 40 degrees in the areas of Humanities and Education, Experimental Sciences, Health Sciences, Social Sciences, Law, and Engineering, spread across seven faculties and schools. According to the <i>Times Higher Education</i> Impact Rankings published in 2021, the institution remains as one of the 100 best universities to adhere to the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals highlighting research, stewardship, outreach and teaching. Jaen is a city of just under 120,000 in south-central Spain. Its impressive architecture includes the Castle of Saint Catherine in the 13th century, the Cathedral of Jaen in the 16th century, the Museum of Arts and Popular Customs.

As a BU student, you can apply for your EHIC/GHIC card using the BU Letter Request Form .
