Housing	The University of Groningen is not a campus university and therefore does not offer campus accommodation. However, through third parties there are many (student) houses and apartments available.			
	The University of Groningen advises exchange students to book accommodation via SSH, an organization that is specialized in international student housing, especially short stay rentals (1 or 2 semesters): https://www.sshxl.nl/en			
	Usually after nomination, students will be provided with detailed information on how to book a room via SSH.			
	As student rooms usually fill up quickly, they advise exchange students to arrange accommodation as early as possible after being admitted to the exchange programme! More housing options for students: www.athomeingroningen.com			
	Please remember to do your own research and read the small prints and reviews before booking any accommodation.			
	 Also ensure that you are only booking accommodation in Bournemouth for the semester that you will be studying at BU. 			
Health Insurance	Exchange students are obliged to arrange for sufficient health insurance coverage during their study period at the University of Groningen.

Visas & Permits	When travelling to Netherlands you must consider what document(s) you will need to enter the country and commence your studies or research at Groningen University. This will depend on the country you are travelling from, your home citizenship, the length of your stay in Netherlands, and the purpose of your stay in Netherlands amongst other criteria.			
	Please make sure to understand what is needed and secure this in time before you travel and that you have an up to date passport that expires no earlier than 6 months after you intend to return.			
	After being accepted for the exchange programme, students are normally contacted by the University of Groningen Immigration Service Desk with instructions for the visa procedure. More
